#### Intellectuals' Dilemma

America's intellectuals evidently had an unhappy time in 1965 and seem likely to have an even vorse one in 1966.

President Lyndon Johnson is a man whose style they do not like. Though many Americans who are not particularly fond of the President ex-press admiration for his 1965 legislative achievements on the domestic front, few in the intellectual community share this response.

Beyond their dislike of his personal make-up, they look upon him as almost perfectly symbolic of all they consider distasteful in the practical uses of governmental power.

A review of American intellectuals' conduct in the years leading to World War II suggests that their younger counterparts today would surely have opposed the war in Viet Nam under any circumstances. But the present war serves them especially as a means of venting their hostility toward the President.

the intellectuals' thumping criticisms of the Viet Nam war serve further to cloak the fact that the big rush of Great Society programs robbed them of most of their favorite domestic issues. There has been huge irony in the circumstance

that a president who had no appeal for them should have done-on the domestic front-so many of the things they said needed doing.

The intellectuals would have been uncom-

fortable praising Johnson for passage of Medicare, civil rights bills, new housing laws and the like. In effect, he took them off the hook by stepping up the fighting in Southeast Asia.

In 1966 their dissatisfaction will surely have even broader scope. Not only is the war expected to widen, but predictions are rife here that it will force curtailment of funds for many Great Society programs as well. The country thus may witness the intellectuals

complaining of injury done to programs they could hardly bring themselves to notice in 1965.

Forecasts are heard in the capital that, in the name of the "peace movement" which embraces many of them, the nation's intellectuals may in 1966 support at the polls either irregular Democrats or outright independents in congressional or

Here and there, such assaults on the President's position might damage his party control and perhaps affect his conduct of the war. Again, however, past history does not suggest that this kind of wading in the practical arena would be of much avail to venturesome intellectuals.

#### Spending To Go Up?

It comes as no surprise for the government to disclose that spending for the current fiscal year ending June 30, 1966, will break through the \$100 billion barrier for the first time in peacetime his-

The projected total is now \$107 billions, but this figure can be taken as a minimum, rather than a maximum. The fact is that costs of the Viet Nam fighting are mounting rapidly, the pace of the in-crease is also rising, and inflationary tendencies generated by these increases are having their ef-fect all across the board on goods and services the

government must purchase.

Under these conditions it is not difficult to envision 1966 fiscal year spending of \$110 billions, with still higher budgets in the years immediately succeeding as some of the administration's new health and welfare programs come into being.

Undoubtedly, a principal factor in the govern-ment's disclosure of spending increases was to condition the public and the Congress to still high-er budget estimates to be disclosed in January. These increases are particularly disturbing to President Johnson, who is not unmindful of the favorable comment he generated during his first year in the White House by accenting economy in

heavy pressure on federal agencies to hold their non-war money requests to an absolute minimum. This is the budget-making season in Washington and the moans of bureaucrats can be heard throughout the city as they receive word of the extent to which their requests have been trimmed in the budget. Trimming is necessary.

The automobile industry has been the target an increasing amount of criticism of late Faced with the ghastly statistic of nearly 50,000 traffic deaths in 1965, it is only human nature to seek an obvious scapegoat to put the blame on.

But while there is undoubted ground for critcism and vast room for improvement, the automakers have done a creditable job of improving the safety of motor vehicles over the years, if only because of the fortunate fact that safety and salability are not always mutually exclusive. Highway User magazine gave manufactur-

Although cars no longer come with heavy. kick-proof fenders, what's underneath is much tougher than it used to be, the makers contend. Broken axles, for example, were once commonplace

Aside from increased durability, many other safety improvements have gone virtually unher-alded, such as safety rim wheels, interlocking door latches, deep-dish steering wheels, padded

glass twice as shatter-resistant as the old type.

It almost seems as if safety has to be slipped into car design unobtrusively or the public won't eccept it. A prime example is the push-button shift wouldn't buy it, preferring to go on impaling them-
