Continuing Battle To Save Redwoods

The battle to save the Redwoods and to create a federal park in Northern California to preserve these giants of the forest is drawing considerable attention in the nation's capital where the plan originated.

The Washington Post, that city's leading newspaper, took cognizance of the fact that this is a problem not alone for California but for the entire nation.

This is what that newspaper editorially had to say on the situation:

"The enthusiasm generated by President Johnson's forthright endorsement of a Redwood National Park in Northern California is dampened by examination of the details of his proposal. Critics offer two major complaints. Many conservationists, including David Brewer, executive director of the Sierra Club, think that the proposed park is located in the wrong place. The other widespread complaint is that it would not be big enough to accomplish the purpose of saving a reasonable portion of the virgin redwoods endangered by the lumbermen's saws.

"What the President has recommended is a linking together of the Jeddiah Smith and Del Norte State Parks near Crescent City, with a substantial expansion of the area to include the Mill Creek watershed. The park would also take in an attractive coastal strip running as far south as the Klamath River. Its total area would be about 48,800 acres, including some 15,000 acres in the existing state parks. Much of the new land to be added is no longer covered with virgin redwoods.

"Under the plan originally favored by the National Park Service and many conservation groups, part of this area would have been saved under a grants-in-aid system. The Redwood National Park would have been located about 25 miles farther south by linking the existing Park Creek State Park to a sub-area of virgin growth on the Redwood Creek watershed. Within this 55,600-acre area are the tallest, second tallest and sixth tallest trees in the world.

"Acceptance of the original plan would give the country two magnificent redwood parks with the possibility of a scenic linkage along the oceanfront. It would also have the advantage of saving a much larger number of the incomparable sequoia sempervirens, some of which are 2200 years old. The Administration plan makes one concession to the experts' preference for the Redwood Creek area. About 1400 acres would be acquired so as to save the tallest trees, and this would become a separate unit of the national park.

"Herein lies the chief disadvantage. Under the original proposal the tall-trees section and the charming valley of Redwood Creek would be the center of a national park ranking with the finest in the world. If only 1400 acres of this wonderland are preserved, it will be but a token of a heritage that has been lost.

"Especially ironical is the fact that the very magnificence of the trees and the soaring prices in the redwood country are reckoned on the basis of the boardfeet of standing timber per acre. The larger the trees, the larger the potential harvest. So some of this land has been selling for more than \$5,000 per acre. Conservation of 40,000 acres at that price would mean an outlay of \$200,000,000. Undoubtedly this is one reason why the Administration turned to the Mill Creek watershed where the land is somewhat less expensive.

"But can the country afford to let this unique and irreplaceable recreation area be mutilated because the cost is high? If the President's plan is to be carried out, the least that can be done, in our view, is to expand the proposed outline to enclose into a park of manageable size. Congress needs to consider not only the cost of this rescue operation but also the greater cost of not doing it."

"You want a quality education for your children? So put them in private school. I'm not paying for your kids." If you aren't satisfied, believe that, public education would not exist without the help of the parents who are able to read and write today.

Some people are against an adequate tax increase because of their personal anger against Vallejo schools. We have our grievances, but remember, OUR CHILDREN are the ultimate consumers of our school tax money. If we indulge our passion for vengeance, we will be punishing innocent children for the actions of those members of our school district who are stupid, incompetent and cruel. We are lucky to have as many good teachers as we do. We don't deserve them. With more money, we can do more to improve the quality of our schools.

Still others oppose higher school taxes because they think themselves and their children are being taxed for the sake of those who are less fortunate. Again, why punish children for the actions of their parents? School board meetings are open to the public. If you have complaints, where you can affect some specific change. Don't denigrate the whole system because you don't approve of part of it.

A few people resist a tax increase because they don't want to pay for what they don't see. Fine. But everything changes. Our seven-year-old child has had three excellent teachers in his three years of school. But the school district expects to retire soon. You will be leaving behind the child who has been taught by three. Who will replace them? A warm body at the head of the class? A babysitter? We are not children who are content with mediocre schedules. Poor teachers are a waste of tax money. We are not children who are content with the slow learners. They have the average ones, and they resent the bright ones. We are not children who are content with the average intelligence, curiosity and a love of learning. We are not children who are content with a mediocre teacher. "That kid here, you know, can't learn his mind though he's not already bright. It is that we are teaching our children." It can happen here. We are not children who are content with the mediocre, "used in Vallejo schools. Is there no place in public education for the bright child?"

Others oppose a tax increase because they feel they can't afford it. No one wants to pay taxes. But an inadequate tax rate means a more expensive final analysis. Good schools cost less to support than private and will far surpass your money's worth.

Frustrations Over War

When J. William Fulbright, Senate Foreign Relations Committee chairman, used the word "frustration" in describing his own attitude, he may have struck the key to the mood of those liberal Democrats who oppose the President on Viet Nam.

There are signs some of these critics may be suffering from the cumulative effects of half a century's history, of events which run mostly against the course they would like the nation and the world to take.

The United States has been involved in either world wars or regional wars with world impact in 22 of the last 82 years. Since World War II began in 1939, we have been in or closely identified with such conflicts steadily, except for one span of five years and another of eight.

This calculation assumes our serious military involvement in South Viet Nam began in late 1961, though we had a narrower identity with the area long before that.

The whole country obviously is affected by such frequent embroilment in conflicts of force. Author Barbara Tuchman, writing of the generation before World War I, says in "The Proud Tower" that after the fighting, the old pre-war enthusiasms "sank beneath a sea of massive disillusionment."

Since then there have been the disappointments of post-war peace endeavors, another world war, the Cold War, Korea and Viet Nam.

Disillusionment must by now be deeply embedded in the national consciousness, even though half the U.S. population has been born since the outbreak of World War II.

Disillusionment usually seems to have bred frustration in some quarters, as American conservatives were frustrated up to 1964 in never having a major party presidential nominee of their own choosing.

In 1966, public relations suggest that the frustrated ones are the more or less doctrinaire liberals.

This helps to explain why Fulbright and other stars are frustrated and trying really for a kind of revolution, a near-total reversal, in America's diplomatic and military policies as they affect the world.

Indonesia And Red Return

Some U.S. government men who analyze these things say the outlook in Indonesia now is for a gradual comeback of the pro-Peking Communist party, unless the army and Masjens remain.

Indonesia's Sukarno may not patch relations with Mao Tse-tung's Red China soon, but his foreign policy in the months ahead is expected to match Peking's anti-West stand paragraph by paragraph.

The Indonesian Communist party went down hard for its part in the abortive coup last October, in which six top Indonesian army generals were murdered. The army and other groups, in an effort to wipe out the pro-Peking Communist apparatus, killed an estimated 100,000 Reds.

Sukarno eliminated Gen. Abdul Nasution and a body of anti-Communist fanatics from his cabinet and added Peking-Communist sympathizers.

Meanwhile, new information arriving here indicates the purge of 100,000 Communists missed large numbers of the powerful Red underground.

If Indonesian history is a precedent, the Communist army is expected to come into the open soon. Instead, they'll hide in the hills and attempt to dominate other political parties.

Mostly likely candidate for infiltration is the National party, already controlled by its left wing. Somewhere in all this there is a lesson to be learned. The United States for years had been bringing potential Indonesian leaders here for education and training. Officials believed this would build a body of good-will and understanding that would keep Indonesia from swinging too far toward the Communists. It appeared for awhile after the abortive coup that this U.S. policy had paid off and that the pro-Peking army in the cabinet might be replaced with nationalists.

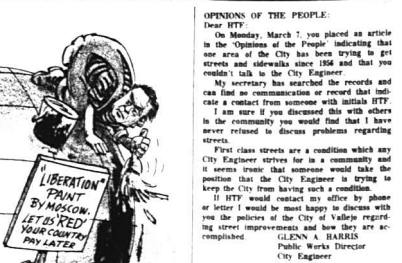

Castro Housing Problem

A short time back, a Havana newspaper showed the photograph of a local working man's home. It had collapsed "completely" almost two months before.

The family was still living in the rubble, the paper reported. It appeared they would be there for some time.

The house had been in deplorable condition before the collapse. Local authorities had condemned the house a year before as unfit for human habitation.

When his house collapsed (luckily at the time he, his wife and two children were out), Jaime Gonzales went to the social affairs secretary of the National Construction Trade Union.

The union men made an inspection. The inspection was verified by the secretary general and the official in charge of housing of the Trade Union Section of the Havana Construction Enterprise under the Ministry of Construction.

They reported also that much of Jaime Gonzales' furniture and other belongings had been buried in the collapse, but that authorities had forbidden any efforts to salvage anything as being too dangerous.

Housing is assigned in Havana, so Jaime Gonzales went to the Housing Control Department to be allocated another home. Department officials refused. Though his house had been condemned, and though living there was prohibited, still they would not assign him another house because a part of his house hadn't collapsed yet.

After 10 days of worrying, Gonzales went back to the department to plead again. This time he was assigned a house he could not move into because it also was dangerous.

Gonzales then found a small wooden house that had been closed for months but was livable. Housing Control said no; he had to take what they assigned or go without.

Three days later, the department sent him notice he'd lost his right to the house they had allocated.

At last report, the Gonzales family was still camping in the rubble of their collapsed house.

Pull Heads From Sand

For far too long a period, Communist China has been isolated from the rest of the world—especially the U.S. and the western world.

There certainly is something to be said for our desire not to recognize Red China, since by doing so we would destroy the position of Chiang Kai-shek's Formosa. On the other hand, the pragmatic practical problems of the world politics and power make it essential that we realize the danger of not having formal in-depth discussions with one of the world's great powers, Communist China.

In an initial break-through on this front, it is interesting to note that although Communist China has long warned its citizens against the "aggressive" tendencies of the West, it is quietly continuing incredibly dynamic expansion of trade with non-Communist countries.

An ironic fact is that this trade expansion has come with two countries that do not recognize Red China and are at some rate at political odds with them—West Germany and Japan. Yet, Peking's trade with West Germany is now three times greater than with East Germany, and Japan has risen to the number one trading partner, outstripping the United States.

Certainly, there are a many things that we as a country and as a people find repugnant about Peking's philosophy. Hopefully, however, we are soon going to reach the point where we will no longer play ostrich with our head in the sand and try to think that a country that is breaking into the modern club and that has the largest population on earth, 700 million—does not really exist. If we play with our head in the sand too much longer, then the meeting with China will be on a military front.

It is a truism that war in this day and age, especially with the ultimate threat of nuclear war, serves no positive purpose, and if it can be avoided, it is a tragedy. We should not, therefore, be playing with our head in the sand, but rather we should stick to a principle that is no longer workable or practical.
