### Victory On Free Speech

Decisions of the U.S. Supreme Court in the field of human liberty can roughly be divided into field of human inserty can roughly be divided into two categories — those which strike into new ground to enlarge the scope of individual rights and those which merely reconfirm rights the people have always exercised.

The first type of decision, especially when it introduces new factors into the American equation, makes headlines. A prime example is the 1954 decision on segregation in the schools.

But the second kind of decision is equally as important, if only to remind us that each generation has to learn anew just what the Constitution means by securing "the blessings of liberty." The

important, if only to remind us that each generation has to learn anew just what the Constitution means by securing "the blessings of liberty." The most recent case in this point is the one concerning James E. Mills, editor of the Birmingham Post-Herald, vs. the State of Alabama.

Editor Mills was arrested in 1962 under the Alabama Corrupt Practices Act, which made it a crime to publish an editorial on election day urging people to vote a certain way. He had called on the voters to abolish Birmingham's commissioner form of government in favor of the mayor-council form.

The U.S. Supreme Court has unanimously ruled this section of the Alabama law unconstitutional.

It was, to be sure, a very small infringement of the First Amendment's protection of free speech and press. It merely forbade editorializing on election issues on an election day.

But everything, including tyranny, starts in small ways. Had Mills accepted this restriction, he and his fellow editors, not only in Alabama but he and his fellow editors, not only in Amazana out, elsewhere in the country, might one day have found they could not editorialize a week in advance of elections, and eventually not at all, either before or after elections.

Far-fetched? The relative swiftness with which the Supreme Court moved in this instance indicates that it did not think so. For Mills, and the substitution of the sub having not yet been tried, was not appealing his conviction under a law he thought unconstitutional, which is the usual procedure. He was protesting his very arrest.
