Decision On Schools

The Vallejo School Board has made a noteworthy effort to see that the community is fully informed about the school tax issue on Tuesday's ballot.

Passage of the issue will continue a \$1.00 supplemental tax approved by the voters twice in the past ten years. It will also provide a 15c increase for rising costs of operation.

We believe that the School District has done a good job of informing the public of the facts in this matter. School officials and volunteer citizens have emphasized the fact that this is only a 15c increase in the "override" tax. Most people seem to be aware that the average homeowner would pay only 44c a month for this badly needed small increase.

Most people now seem to be aware, too, that the wording of the ballot, page 6, Measure A, is required by law and that the apparent \$1.15 increase, in fact, actually continues the existing \$1.00 tax and adds only 15c.

However, we are concerned that one fact of the matter may not have been emphasized sufficiently. That is, if the measure fails, the district will lose 10 per cent or nearly \$1,000,000 of its budget. Failure of the measure, in other words, not only loses the 15c increase but the continuing \$1.00. The term for this continuing \$1.00 expires as of June 30, 1966.

If the voters truly understand the disastrous result to the children's education, there should not be any question about approving this issue by voting YES Tuesday.

Write-In For Young

Assemblyman Pearce Young, who has done an outstanding job of representing Solano and Napa Counties in the lower house for the past four years, is seeking the state senator post from Solano, Napa and Marin Counties.

Reappointment of the State Senate, in accordance with U.S. Supreme Court dictates, has necessitated the changing of boundaries which in many cases have deprived certain areas of the state with active and experienced legislators.

In the new 4th District, which includes Solano, Napa and Marin, we have been more fortunate than most since we have a young man with an impressive record of accomplishment seeking the office.

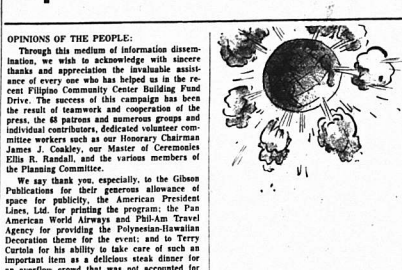
