Great Society Funds

High on the list of President Johnson's tough economic decisions is the question of how much more money to ask Congress to appropriate next year for Great Society programs.

Any sizable increase could prove to be one more critical stimulant in an economy already overheated by too many stimulators and destined to feel the effect of still others in the months ahead.

Well-remarked is the prospect of an early presidential request for an extra \$10-\$15 billion in funds for the Viet Nam war. But that will not be the end of it. Next year's regular request for war funds is sure to be higher than the 1966-67 figure, even if the President again postpones asking for part of the need.

Equally well-publicized is the outlook for a very heavy round of wage increases in late 1966 and 1967, involving such industries as electrical products, the telephone system, rubber, machinery and machinery.

Triggered by rising prices, these major requests for Great Society programs, these major wage increases may initiate a wage-price spiral that will make 1966 look like the belt of calms.

Confronted with all this constantly building pressure, the President will have to agonize over the immediate future of his cherished Great Society endeavors in education, housing, welfare, etc.

His budget message this January acknowledged that he was asking Congress to vote \$2.1 billion more for these programs than in the previous year. Some sleuths thought a careful reading of the budget put the increase in requests closer to \$3.5 billion.

However that may be, the House already has voted to spend some \$500 million among the budget request for Great Society projects and others falling under the Labor-Health-Education-Welfare appropriation. Even a heavy Senate as probably would not chop all this increase.

Obviously Johnson will make no determination of his 1967-68 requests until he sees finally what Congress has done this year. But the same factors which led him to seek a Great Society fund hike this year will be working on him again.

The authorizing legislation for these programs contains formulas which prescribe year-by-year escalation in outlays, especially in education, to match rising population and other changes.

Neither the President nor Congress is compelled to provide the full amount authorized in the climbing scale. But he has strong motivation for keeping that upward push going.

With the aid of the overwhelmingly Democratic 89th Congress, LBJ put these programs back with resounding emphasis. The weak Republican opposition made only futile gestures of protest.

In the President's view, to hold down these programs severely by shutting off their projected fund increases would be to award the Republicans a victory-by-default after they had once been crushed.

Shaping this year's budget, Johnson sought to deny the GOP that victory while still holding Great Society funds below authorized sums.

His goal inevitably will be the same for the coming year, but the strain on his political resolve will be greater. Higher wage spending and other escalation factors in his domestic projects will make it extremely difficult to bend the federal government's needs into a budget that can be sold to the American people as suitable for an overheated economy which is already noisily hissing steam.

The President's anguish is bound to be magnified by two things—his evident conviction that any major hold-down on education outlays would be damaging to the country, and his wish to disarm the Kennedy-Ribicoff competition by spending handsomely to rebuild U.S. cities.

In any event, the President appears determined to act.

SAN RAFAEL (AP)—Robert D. Sibeck, 18, a San Anselmo Marine Corps recruit, was charged Monday with killing Marin County rancher Everett Zimmerman and his wife.

Sibeck, now stationed at Millington Naval Air Station in Memphis, Tenn., was home on leave last month when the killings occurred.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ramona Sibeck of San Anselmo, were old friends of the murdered couple. His sister, Elise Kay, was an overnight guest in the Zimmerman home the night of the slayings.

Bruce Bales, Marin County's district attorney, said Sibeck would be taken before a civilian magistrate in Memphis to start return procedures. Sibeck told investigators he would waive extradition.

The rancher and his wife, Margaret, were beaten to death with a board.

Soviet File Raid?

The strong Red Chinese demonstrations in front of the Soviet embassy in Peking had two major objectives.

One was obvious. There are a large number of Communists in Red China's upper ranks who feel a strong attachment to Russian communism. Some see need for Soviet military and economic aid. Some are emotionally attached to the Soviet historically as the "mother" of communism. Some like the Soviet approach.

It is known that Mao Tse-tung and Lin Piao see this emotional attachment to the Soviet Union as a weakness. It lowers their own authority within China. It leads to too much trust in the Soviet Union.

Lin Piao believes personally that it is not wise to trust any country too much, whether it's enemy, neutral or ally.

Mao and Lin thus feel the need to destroy these attachments, thus one reason for the demonstrations at the Soviet embassy.

[This pressure for anti-Soviet demonstrations will not prevent Mao and Lin from making an alliance of convenience with Moscow if they believe it will serve their purposes. The old alliance with the Soviet Union was just such a useful alliance.]

There was possibly a second purpose for the demonstrations.

A defector from the Hungarian secret police made this possibility clear in his report on a Communist demonstration on Viet Nam before the U.S. legation in Hungary last year.

The Hungarian Security and Intelligence Service planned the demonstration in coordination with the Communist party and other branches of the government. A huge sum of money was allocated in advance to pay for damages.

The purpose, said Laszlo Szabo, the defector, a former major in the Hungarian Security and Intelligence Service, was "to use the confusion to break into the American legation and grab some material—files and such."

"Security officers, almost all the staff of the Hungarian Security and Intelligence Service sought the American legation were put among the demonstrators for this purpose. But they could not break in. They could not find any opportunity to manage it."

The idea of the Soviet KGB and the Hungarian Security Intelligence Service, says Szabo, is always "penetrate, penetrate, penetrate."

The Red Chinese possibly use the same tactics.

Regardless of whether Mao Tse-tung and Lin Piao intend to work more closely with the Russians or oppose them more vigorously, Mao and Lin are not about to trust the Kremlin.

New Grand For Library Is Approved

Federal Funds Totalling \$900,000 Now Promised

A new federal grant of \$169,049 has boosted the government's contribution to a proposed Vallejo Public Library in the Marina Vista area to \$900,000.

Executive Director James D. Richardson last night told Vallejo Redevelopment Agency officials that the additional federal funds have been approved by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare and asked for their approval of an amendment to the agency's agreement with the Library Association of the City of Vallejo, California, which administers the grants.

A grant of \$700,000 previously was approved by the federal government for the local library project.

The resolution was one of three relating to the library adopted by the board upon the motions of Richard Cavitt.
