Cancer In Thailand

The man had been a senior commander in Ho Chi Minh's Communist Loanlan Front some years back.

"You people don't know how deep our preparations run," he said. "Take this example. About 15 years ago, the Thai police let out the contract for building a border fort in this area. A certain contractor won the bid. He built the fort with 300 men. Two hundred of those workmen were our troops. That is, they were Ho's guerrillas. We know the fort inside out."

"This is the sort of careful planning that has gone into the infiltration of northeast Thailand."

"We've moved at this slowly. For 15 years our men have circled in the northeast. For one thing, we've been looking for poor, unhappy farmers whose ties are closer to Laos than to Thailand. They're most susceptible. We've taken the most promising of these men out, trained them, brought them back to work their own neighborhoods."

"A Thai long-time northeast businessman whose job gets him around much of the area— estimates a fourth of the far northeastern farmers feel a great emotional attachment to Laos than to Thailand."

He marks on the map in little circles the areas where the Laos emotional influence is strong. He points out the stage-by-stage growth of the Communist underground in this far northeast Thailand region.

This underground structure he describes has expanded across over the past 15 years from the Laos border almost over the northern part of the country. It's been a hop-and-a-skipp jumping from one circled area to the next and spreading like an oil spot out from the heart of each circle.

The former Ho officer says: "Our other major objective was the large Vietnamese community here, the families which moved to northeast Thailand during the war against the French. Most of them have not become part of the Thai community."

The Thai businessman makes another grouping of circles to show where these Vietnamese groups are strongest.

Cities in this region stand out as islands in the circled communities.

"The businessman jabs his pencil at the cities. "Much of the business and money lending is controlled by Chinese merchants," he says. "They do not do our civic activities. But their sons go to Red China for schooling. No one knows how they leave Thailand. One day, suddenly a boy is gone. They also send considerable sums of money to Communist China."

"We know there are Peking agents among them. This is Red organizing among the Chinese, these Chinese merchants. But we don't know who, has been going on for at least a decade."

The Chinese businessmen are all over Thailand. But the Vietnamese emigrants and the people emotionally oriented to Laos are concentrated in the extreme northwest.

So far, underground Communism is a critical problem only in this relatively small northeast area.

The Communists are having recruiting troubles as they try to move out of this region into other areas in Thailand.

Sniff Please And Live

British bobbies, traditionally unarmed, are now carrying a new weapon. This is not a gun but a "sniffer sniffer"—an alcohol detector. It is already credited with significantly reducing traffic accidents, says Rodale's Health Bulletin.

Scotland Yard has instructed policemen to station themselves at strategic locations, such as pubs and parking lots. Whenever an officer spots a citizen who looks a bit under the weather, he approaches and with customary British politeness invites the person to breathe into the detector. If it rings, the erstwhile driver is persuaded to go home in a cab.

The "sniffer sniffer" met with objections at first on the ground that it was an invasion of privacy, but British courts have upheld it use.

Bridle On The Bug

Article IV of the Bill of Rights of the Constitution states:

"The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the person or things to be seized."

The authors of the Bill of Rights did not, of course, know anything about telephones or the tapping thereof, nor did they even dream of devices which could enable an eavesdropper to listen to conversations from a distance. To them, unreasonable search and seizure was someone breaking down their door and confiscating evidence without benefit of a lawfully issued warrant.

Yet the tapping of a private telephone conversation or the bugging of a hotel room would seem to be as much a search and seizure of information as would be the actual physical intrusion of an unauthorized investigator and his stealing a personal letter.

The great difference is that the traditional form of search and seizure is overt, visible and easily controllable by legal safeguards. The modern form is subtle, invisible and indiscriminate. Anyone with the necessary knowledge and equipment can get into the snooping act.

The law of the land, however, by virtue of a 1928 Supreme Court decision, is that since wiretapping does not involve trespassing on private property, it is not a violation of the Fourth Amendment.

But six years later, the Federal Communications Act of 1934 made it a federal crime to intercept and divulge the contents of a private telephone conversation. In 1939, the Supreme Court ruled that wiretap evidence was inadmissible in federal courts.

This says nothing about the several states, some of which permit wiretapping evidence and some of which don't. Moreover, there is no federal law banning the use of other forms of electronic snooping devices which operate independently of telephone wires.

Thus electronic eavesdropping is both lawful and unlawful, and both an accepted and a condemned tool of police surveillance. This ambiguous legal and moral situation has lately given rise to the unedifying spectacle of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy and FBI director J. Edgar Hoover trying to pin the responsibility on each other for the wiretapping carried on when Kennedy was attorney general.

Government wiretapping is still going on, but nobody seems to know to what extent. It is supposed to be limited to matters involving the national security, although no law or court order ever authorized this. As according to Rep. Emanuel Celler of New York, even "members of Congress are afraid to pick up a phone and do their regular chores these days for fear somebody is listening."

Celler's House Judiciary Committee has repeatedly refused to allow the Justice Department to expand its wiretapping activities beyond national security cases, and Congress as a whole has consistently refused to pass bills legalizing wiretapping.

On the one hand, federal and some state law prohibits wiretapping; on the other, federal and some state lawmen use it every day. It is time the lawmakers and law enforcers got together and wrote a new and clear law, not only governing wiretapping but bugging in general.

The law cannot univert electronics, but it can try to control it.

To the contrary, service clubs and leading dignitaries will remain strictly mute lest they be branded as "reactionary." Many churches and schools will extend great effort to protect the "rights" of conscientious objectors and beatniks who will vilify our fighting men for performing their patriotic duty. Often these institutions will openly denounce patriotism, patriotism, and even God.

Populists will frequently tell my friend to surrender, never will the ballots tell him to fight for God, honor and victory. The mass media will use its time and space to tell me to tell about the protests, and to tell about those who are giving aid and comfort to the enemy. Yet, my demands for "unconditional surrender." Now we pitifully beset for "negotiations." Against Russia's enemy our bombers killed estimated 200,000 men, women and children during one raid over Dresden, Germany. To my knowledge, not one Marxist pacifist humanitarian has ever been in the streets with protesting placard in nuclear hand.

This concern is the staff of our life, the problems of our existence. That is why I write to you—you and I as veterans need to be concerned about our well-being.

For your own good, sign up with a Veterans Organization and one of us will speak out for you. World War I veterans should join the Veterans of War and the I. O. O. F.

Membership is available to any veteran in the AMVETS who serves a 60-day tour in the Armed Forces from September 18, 1946, to a future date to be subsequently determined by the Government of the United States.

You are eligible to belong to the American Legion if you served honorably in the Military or Naval Service from September 18, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December 7, 1941 to September 2, 1945; or from July 27, 1950 to July 27, 1952; or those veterans who served on or after August 2, 1964.

See eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars providing you were veterans of any of the following medals: Victory Medal with clasp, Army of Occupation (WWI), American Defense Service Medal, European African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, American Theater Medal, American Campaign Medal with clasp, Army Occupation (WWI), European Service Medal, Navy Service Medal, and the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal.

Membership in the Disabled American Veterans is an honor reserved exclusively for those veterans who were wounded, gassed, injured or disabled as a direct result of honorable wartime service in the Armed Forces.

There are other veterans organizations you may wish to join and you will find each has the same purpose in mind, championing the veteran's cause, and operating on a non-partisan, non-sectarian, and non-political basis.
