may actually be good for you.

At any rate, that's one indication of a test made, appropriately in Los Angeles.

Dr. E. J. Malmstrom of the UCLA Brain Reports.

search Institute claims to have found clear evidence of the relationships between the various

dence of the relationships, between the various kinds of airborne pollutants and emotional states, reports the Los Angeles Times. For example, a high level of sulfur dioxide in the air made volunteer students participating in the test less anxious. A high level of carbon monoxide made them less aggressive. A high level of ozone made them more friendly.

The effects were mixed, however. Sulfur di-oxide reduced the ability to concentrate and made the subjects less friendly. Ozone made the palms sweat, suggesting it increase emotional stress. All the different kinds of pollutants had essenof heartheat and breathing.

Malmstrom can't explain the reasons for these emotional changes. It may be chemical. It may be due to the effect of faster breathing on the circulation. Or it may all be in the mind.

'Besides," he says, "we made the tests at a time of year when smog was light."

Atomic Bombs For Sale

For the price of a fully equipped executive jet, any old millionaire can now afford his own atomic

The Atomic Energy Commission is asking \$350,000 for a 10-kiloton device, the size of the Hiroshima bomb. A two-metagon device, equal to two million tons of TNT, costs \$600,000.

Not any old millionaire can buy one, however. The bombs are for use in AEC-approved under-ground explosions, such as the recent Gas Buggy experiment, to open up otherwise untappable de-posits of gas oil and minerals.

The price does not include the costs of drilling, planting the device, reopening the cavity or extracting the raw material inside it, if any,




