# Logical Question On Issues

Even as North and South plunged into the maelstrom of war more than a century ago, Abraham Lincoln attempted to offer reason in place of force. He proposed that the government purchase all of the nation's four million slaves for \$1,000 apiece, or a total of \$4 billion.

The South, not thinking beyond the military victory it felt confident of achieving, was not interested. Nor is it certain that the North would have agreed to what in those days was a fantastic

spent much more of its treasure in four years of fierce war, as well as losing 500,000 of its soldier sons—40,000 of whom, it should be remembered,

Today, we stand on the brink of another crisis involving the Negro in America. And again, voices of reason tell us that only an immense expenditure of money — and even more important, immense will—can avert a far costlier catastrophe.

Though the report of the President's Na-tional Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders put no price tag on its formula for averting future riots and a virtual breakdown of society, early rumors spoke of \$20 to \$25 billion

According to a story by Scripps-Howard writer Don Kirkman last December, the commission abandoned the idea of calling for such a massive assault on riot-breeding conditions because

The country, however, is standing still for the spending of an even greater sum annually in the Vietnam war—a war in which many Negroes are again giving their lives for a country not their

This is not to question the necessity of that war. It is merely to suggest some questions.

If we are prepared to send, as President

Johnson has promised we will, whatever is necessary to prosecute a war being fought avowedly to sary to prosecute a war being fought avowenty to bring freedom to a foreign darker-skinned people, are we willing and can we afford to do no less for our own dark-skinned citizens?

There is great demand for clamping down on the rioters. Is it possible that we may in the end opinions of the property as we have in Vietnam, find ourselves destroying American cities in order to "save" them?

With severe new riot-control laws, beefed-up police and National Guard units and vigilante ommittees, are we reconciled to erecting a garri-

Will we, while defending the integrity of a nation 12,000 miles away, do nothing to prevent the tearing of America itself asunder?

The commission minced no words. It was no Communist conspiracy, no plot of fanatics that caused the riots of the past years. They arose from an explosive mixture of generations-old, pervaging discriminating vasive discrimination and segregation fashioned by white racism, pure and simple.

"Our nation," warns the commission, "is moving toward two societies-one black, one white separate and unequal."

Sober Lesson For U.S. Just as the Communist Tet offensive set off a

fundamental re-evaluation of America's ability o fight and win a limited, guerrilla-style war, the gold crisis has dealt a stunning blow to the il-

For the first time in history American tour. ists in London and Paris found their travelers' checks refused. Suddenly, the mighty U.S. dollar was so much paper—for a few hours.

This, of course, can be attributed to unreasoning panic and short-sighted speculation, as can much of the gold-buying spree in the markets of Europe in past weeks. The dollar was not and is not in danger of collapse.

crisis, in effect, amounted to a vote of no confidence on the part of foreigners that the United States can continue the massive outlays it is making in the prosecution of the Vietnam war and still permit the domestic economy to go booming along without gravely eroding the dollar's strength as the stable rock undergirding the world's monetary system. It was, indeed, an unnistakable warning that we cannot do so.

The decision by the United States and the six Western European countries who make up the London Gold Pool to freeze their monetary gold stocks out of the reach of private speculators

Though there are doubts about how well the two-price system can work over the long run, by treating the immediate symptom it has bought as a little time in which the basic causes of the malady can be attended to.

The two chief curse recommended by the fiscal physicians are not palatable. They include an immediate tax increase—at least the 10 per cent surnedarge requested by President Johnson last fall land possibly more—coupled with a drastic reduction in government spending that will hit every body's favorite project.

The lesson is clear. The United States may be strong—strong enough to do just about what it wants, including the waging of a war in the jurice and cities of a nation 10.000 miles away while at the same time attempting the refurbishing of its own countryside and urban center—but that strength cannot be employed indefinitely without the exercise of the most stringent fiscal discipline.
